After School Tutoring: HMS provides after school tutoring Monday through Friday from 2:30 to 4:00 P.M. This service is provided for those students who need additional tutoring help or access to a computer for schoolwork.

Assignment Books: Students receive an assignment book the first week of school. The student handbook is included. Students should be encouraged to keep an organized notebook/trapper and to use a backpack/book bag. Backpacks and book bags must be kept in lockers.

Lockers: Each student is assigned a locker with a built-in combination lock for books, coats, etc. Students will be issued a combination lock for Physical Education. Students will be charged for lost or damaged locks.

Parent Involvement: HMS actively promotes parental involvement through:

- **PTO:** Meets on the first Monday of each month at 9 A.M.
- **Choir Boosters:** Meets on the 4th Monday of each month at 7 P.M. at HHS
- **Band Boosters:** Meets on the 4th Tuesday of each month at 7 P.M. at HHS
- **Athletic Boosters:** Meets on the 1st Monday of each month at 7 P.M. at HHS

School Hours: The school day begins at 7:30 A.M. and ends at 2:20 P.M.

School Supplies: Students in all grades are asked to have the following general supplies: pens, pencils, colored pencils, ruler, one-subject folders for each subject, notebook paper and a three ring binder or trapper keeper. Students should also have a math calculator (we recommend the TI-34; students do not need a graphing calculator). Teachers will specify any other supplies at a later time.

Transportation: For student drop-off or pick-up between 7:00 and 7:30 a.m. or 2:00 and 2:30 p.m.: Private transportation must enter and exit from Wilbur Road, on the west (back) of the building. Do not drop-off or pick up at the front door, or try to exit onto Rt. 94. This has been determined as the safest drop off procedure and helps to eliminate congestion for the buses (see map).

At the end of the day, students staying after school must be under the supervision of an adult or staff member. Any student needing to be dropped off at a stop other than their assigned stop must present a note, signed by a parent, to the school office.

Parents will be able to access their child's grade through **Parent Assist**, a web-based program. Grades will be posted by teachers throughout each grading period to help parents view student progress.

Report Cards: Report Cards are sent home with students 3 times a year and mailed at the end of the year a week after the last day of school. Check the school calendar for dates.

PaySchools is an on-line payment system that allows parents to pay student fees and place money into their child's lunch account. Information will be sent home and is also available on the district web page.

Interscholastic Sports – Grades 7-8

Highland Middle School is a member of the Suburban League and participates in the following sports:

Activity Nights: With the assistance of PTO, HMS offers 4-5 activity nights per year. These include games and contests, dancing, board games, computer lab, basketball, food and snacks. BIONIC Night: Annual 7th grade healthy lifestyle program held from 4:45 - 10:00 p.m. in early Spring. Also features a parent meeting, student carnival, entertainment and dance.

Bowling Club:	For 6 th graders only, after school in February-March.
Drama Club:	Ongoing for 6 th , 7 th and 8 th grade students.
Girls Choir:	8 th Grade Girls held after school on Fridays.
Guys Choir:	8 th Grade Guys held after school on Fridays.
Jazz Band:	7 th and 8 th grade band students held after school on Thursdays.
Musical Production:	Tryouts in January. Rehearsals and performance January - April.
National Junior Honor Society:	Induction in May. Promotes several service projects throughout the year, including Canned Food Drive, etc.
Power of the Pen:	7 th & 8 th grade teams compete in district, regional and state competitions in February, March and May. Sixth graders can participate in practice sessions, usually held weekly after school from 2:30 – 3:45 p.m.
Ski Club:	6 th , 7 th and 8 th grades - held on Saturdays in January-February.
School Newspaper:	Ongoing for 6 th , 7 th and 8 th grade students.
Spelling Bee:	February, in the evening.
STUCO:	Student Council (ongoing activities, monthly meetings).
Women’s Seminar:	Leadership workshop held annually for selected 8 th grade girls.
Men’s Seminar:	Leadership workshop held annually for selected 8 th grade boys.
Young Authors:	Workshop held usually May during the school day.
