Although Halloween at Sharon may look a little differently this year, we are hoping to bring some spooky fun by allowing students to wear costumes to school on October 30, if they choose. Teachers will be incorporating some fall - themed learning activities as well. We are not going to accept food donations/pass out food. We hope to make it a fun day for kids! A few guidelines for costumes:

- ★ Students should wear their costume to and from school. We will not have students go to the restroom to change.
- ★ Costumes must be able to be worn in school comfortably (and on the bus). Families should keep in mind students will have their typical school day (recess, lunch, specials).
- ★ Students should be able to use the restroom independently without needing to remove their costume.
- ★ Costumes cannot include a mask, as students must still wear the required face covering.
- ★ No bulky costumes/costumes with accessories.

ARRIVAL CAR RIDERS

Students may be dropped off between 8:40-8:55 AM. Cars will not be able to drive behind the building until 8:40 due to buses unloading until that time. Once entering through the gate in the morning, please follow the grass line and make a wide loop since the buses have already cleared.

If driving southbound on Route 94 please do not attempt to make a left turn into the car line. This creates extra congestion on Ridge Road. Continue driving south to Sharon Circle and enter the car rider line on the northbound side.



DISMISSAL CAR RIDERS

Cars will be able to drive behind the building no earlier than 2:45 due to playground activity. Please do not arrive earlier due to the congestion it creates on Ridge Road. Once entering through the gate in the afternoon, please drive in front of the yellow cone and make a straight line into the pick-up loop. This allows room for the buses to pull in for dismissal.

All car riders must use the school issued placard every day at pick up time. This placard should be placed so it is visible. The staff person on duty will recognize the placard and allow the student(s) to go to the correct car.

THIRD GRADE READING GUARANTEE

As mandated by SB316, Ohio school districts must follow stipulations set forth in the Third Grade Reading Guarantee. This legislation strives to ensure that every child will be reading at grade level by the end of their third grade year. For more detailed information on the Third Grade Guarantee, visit the Ohio Department of Education's website at www.ode.state.oh.us. As part of the requirements, all children in grades K-3 are given a reading diagnostic assessment to determine if they have met the standards for the previous school year and are on track for reading at their present grade level. Students who are deemed not on track will be placed on a Reading Improvement and Monitoring Plan. A provision of the law states that if a student is not reading at grade level by the end of third grade, he or she may be retained (as measured by the Grade 3 ELA assessment/state approved alternative). Third graders will take the state ELA assessment on **October 26-27**, and will have a second opportunity in the spring.

SYMPTOM CHECKLIST

I am including a Covid Daily Checklist (see attached) for you to utilize at home. This checklist can also be located on our District's website.

As stated on our District's website, if individuals present any of these symptoms, they are required to stay home:

- Take temperature (100.0 or higher)
- Cough
- Shortness of breath
- Chills
- Muscle Pain
- Fatigue
- Sore throat
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea
- Congestion
- Runny nose
